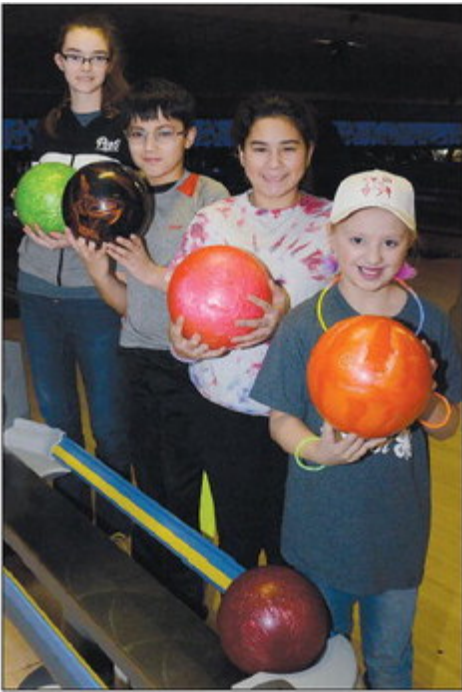


Ozaukee County Fairgrounds.
