

Ozaukee County Leaders Board Meeting  
Thursday, June 15th, 2017 7:30PM

The meeting was called to order at 7:39pm and began with the pledges. Following pledges the secretary's report was put up for approval. Jody Brzezinski made a motion to accept the secretary's report, and her motion was seconded by Barb Batzko. The motion passed.

The treasurer's report was given. Carol Boehlke made a motion to put the treasurer's report on file, and her motion was seconded by Brenda Mueller. The motion passed.

The annual county board exchange will be occurring on August 16th, beginning at 8:00am. The county still needs more youth volunteers to fill the available spots.

Mackenzie Neumann read aloud the correspondence that concerned the board. Following that roll call was taken.

It was announced that many on the board have reached their final term and there needed to be new volunteers to be on the board. Elections will be occurring soon, and all current youth on the board will be done serving their time.

The leaders paired up in order to cover the S.M.A.R.T. goals and discuss some of the goals the clubs and county have and how we can specify them to make them more achievable.

A reminder was given that all youth need to sign up for fair on show works as there will be no late entries accepted.

There will be tours of the fairgrounds and a discussion with all the new families in 4-H that attend the new family fair meeting.

There is still time for youth to sign up to run for Miss/Mr. Ozaukee. The fun day will be held at Dorothy Parchim's house on July 19th at 3:30.

The 2nd annual after fair swim party will be occurring the Sunday after the fair! The party will be held at the Cedarburg Pool again, and there will be no admission cost to any 4-H youth and families.

The meeting was adjourned around 9:00pm. A motion to adjourn was made by Dan Paulus and seconded by Clara Paulus.
