The Grammy Award-winning Charlie Daniels Band will headline the Grandstand Stage at 7:30 p.m. Friday, Aug. 5, with special guest The WhiskeyBelles from Milwaukee.

The Charlie Daniels Band, which has been performing since 1972, is best known for hits like "The Devil Went Down to Georgia," "Long Haired Country Boy," "The South's Gonna Do It Again," "In America" and "The Legend of Wooley Swamp."

Born in 1936 in Willimington, N.C., Daniels recorded his first solo album in 1970. He was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame this year

The rest of the band includes Bruce Brown on lead guitar, Charlie Hayward on bass guitar, Chris Wormer on guitar, Shannon Wickline on keyboards and Ron Gannaway on drums.

Tickets prices are \$35 for VIP and \$20 for general admission seats.

The only other event requiring admission is the second annual Barnyard 5-kilometer run/walk. The cost for participants age 12 and up is \$25 and those younger than 12 pay \$15.


