What is Experiential Learning?

Are you familiar with the Experiential Learning Model?

Experiential learning combines activities with questions to help youth learn. Experiential Learning helps youth to be engaged in their own experiences. Rather than telling youth what they should do and learn, they have the opportunity to discover their own learning through a guided process.

4-H has adopted a process that allows youth to learn through a carefully planned "doing" experience that is followed by leader-led discussion using purposeful questions.

The Experiential Learning Model includes five specific steps:

- 1. Youth experience the activity- perform or do it.
- 2. Youth share the experience by describing what happened.
- 3. Youth process the experience to determine what was most important and identify common themes.
- 4. Youth generalize from the experience and relate it to their daily lives.
- 5. Youth apply what they learned to a new situation.

When this model is used, youth both experience and process the activity. They learn from thoughts and ideas about the experience. Each step contributes to their learning.

New Volunteer Orientation Dates

Thank you to Larry & Deb Newell for all of their work in organizing the 4-H Recycling Initiative at the Ozaukee County Fair! This year, Ozaukee 4-H families helped to recycle 820 pounds of aluminum! Ozaukee 4-H is receiving a check for \$369.00! Perhaps you noticed significantly less garbage around the Fair this year. The Ozaukee County Fair Board made the decision to sell only contained beverages this year. With the help from Ozaukee 4-H, we have made large strides in reducing our carbon footprint during the Fair over the past 3 years! Location has changed!! Due to conflicts for dates with Port Washington High School we have to pick a different venue this year. Please note new location above.

ENTRY FEE: A \$15 per act entry fee will be needed to defray the cost of the school rent-al. Fee can be paid by the club or individual and must accompany your entry.

DEADLINE: Applications are due Friday February 9th 2018. No late entries will be accepted.

Each club is allowed up to 3 (three) acts. If the club has more than 60 members, the club is allowed 1 (one) additional act for every 20 (twenty) members. Example: If your club has 115 members, it is allowed 2 additional acts for a total of 5 acts.

TYPES OF PERFORMANCES:

Vocal, 1-3 people singing a selection or medley, 4 minutes max.

Instrumental, a selection or combination of 2 selections, 3 minutes max.

Dance, 4 minutes max

Play/Skit/Novelty, Drama with or without music, 9 minutes max.

ACT CLASSIFICATIONS: Small group acts are 3 people or less; large group acts are 4+ people.

COMBINATION ACT: Combination acts involving up to 3 clubs or county wide project acts are encouraged.



AWARDS: Peg

Thomson - Best of Show; Large Act -1st and 2nd place; Small Act -1st and 2nd place

VOLUNTEERS: Each act is required to provide 2 volunteers to help during the night of the show. These people should not be the person directing the group's performance or a youth in the act. If there are not any volunteers from a given act on the night of the show, that act will be ineligible for awards.

TICKET SALES: Advanced tickets will be available on audition day. Advance tickets will be \$3.00 for adults and \$2.00 for children. Night of the show - tickets are \$5.00 for adults and \$4.00 for children.


These workshops will be hands-on, interactive sessions intended to help members prepare their materials and practice their interviewing skills. This is a great life skill, so don't miss out!


