4-H Re-enrollment Time...Here Already!

Can you believe it's time to reenroll already?

September is re-enrollment time for 4-H. Ozaukee County 4-H had a wonderful 2015-2016 year! 625 Youth participated in Ozaukee County 4-H in the current year. It's now time to re-enroll for 2016-2017!

Important Dates:

September 3rd: Re-enrollment available on 4-H Online

September 30th: Current 4-H Youth Re-enrollment **DEADLINE.**

November 1st: Last day to add ALL projects



Instructions are located online for re-enrollment in 4-H Online. [Re-enroll Instructions](#). The new year's enrollment will be available beginning September 3rd. Please use Chrome or Firefox with 4H Online webpage. Remember that all current 4-H youth **MUST** reenroll by the end of the day on September 30th. After the 30th, 4H Online will lock for re-enrolling. Please remember to use your current 4-H Online account when re-enrolling (you should **not** have to create a new account). We ask that you please **double-check** that all information is current/accurate and spelling/ punctuation is correct. This will help save some office time when reviewing/approving re-enrollments. Thank you!

Also, remember that club dues also need to be paid by September 30th.

The Leaders Association will pay for a green 4-H t-shirt for **ALL YOUTH** enrollments and re-enrollments this September!

Adult Leaders: If you haven't voted for one of the 4-H Adult Awards, please do so by the end of the day today, Sept. 7th. The Friend of 4-H and Leadership Recognition Awards will be presented at the Leader Recognition Banquet on Sunday, September 25th.

Ozaukee County Leadership Recognition Award

The 4-H Leadership Recognition Award is designed to honor an outstanding leader, group or organization within the Ozaukee County 4-H Program. Nominees for this award should be current 4-H'ers, leaders or families, and their involvement and leadership in the Ozaukee County 4-H Program should demonstrate a willingness and drive to consistently excel at performing their regular 4-H Leadership responsibilities.



Friend of 4-H Award

The Friend of 4-H Award is designed to honor individuals, groups or businesses who have made contributions to 4-H on a countywide basis. These contributions to 4-H may be in the form of personal services, leadership, special training, publicity, or financial support. The recipient should also have a meaningful involvement in 4-H, is committed to the philosophy of 4-H Youth Development and has demonstrated high personal standards. Any recognition given to the recipient should be supported by and well received by the people of the county. Past nominees may be re-nominated for consideration. The application process needs to be followed with a current written nomination form.

New Volunteer Orientation

We welcome all new volunteers and thank you for your willingness to serve in this capacity. 4-H takes steps to ensure a safe and healthy environment for youth and encourages safeguards for adult leaders.

Each new volunteer is required to attend one evening of new volunteer orientation. Volunteers who have not enrolled in the last five years must also be retrained.

This year a new orientation program will be in place. The orientation meeting and process will still run through the Extension office and meetings will be held at the Admin. Building. However, the state 4-H office will now be conducting background checks and corresponding with adults regarding this process. This

process will extend the timeline for new adult approvals to approximately three weeks. Therefore, if you are interested in becoming an adult volunteer with Ozaukee 4-H, please keep the extended time line in mind and sign-up early before the event(s) you wish to volunteer for.
