Ozaukee County 4-H in the current year. September marks the month to re-enroll in Ozaukee 4-H for 2017-2018!

Important Dates:

September 6th: Re-enrollment available on 4-H Online

September 30th: Current 4-H Youth Re-enrollment DEADLINE.

November 1st: Last day to add ALL projects

Instructions are located online for re-enrollment in 4-H Online. <u>Re-enroll</u> <u>Instructions</u>. The new year's enrollment will be available beginning September 6th. Please use Chrome or Firefox with 4H Online webpage. Remember that all current 4-H youth MUST reenroll by the <u>end of the day</u> on September 30th. After the 30th, 4H Online will lock for re-enrolling. Please remember to use your current 4-H Online account when re-enrolling (you should **not** have to create a new account). We ask that you please **double-check** that all information is current/ accurate and spelling/ punctuation is correct. This will help save some office time when reviewing/approving re-enrollments. Thank you!

Also, remember that club dues also need to be paid by September 30th.

The Leaders Association will pay for a 4-H t-shirt for **ALL NEW YOUTH** enrollments this September!

Any other youth or adults that would like to purchase a 4-H t-shirt, may do so for \$10 each. Please look for sizing information and order form at your next general meeting or contact your general leader by October 14th.

New Volunteer Orientation Dates

As we kick off another 4-H year, we welcome all new volunteers and thank you for your willingness to serve in this capacity. 4-H takes steps to ensure a safe and healthy environment for youth and encourages safeguards for adult leaders.

Each new volunteer is required to attend one evening of new volunteer orientation. Volunteers who have not enrolled in the last five years must also be retrained.

Beginning last year, a new orientation program is in place. The orientation meeting and process will still run through the Extension office. However, the state 4-H office now conducts background checks and corresponds directly with adults regarding this process. This process extends the timeline for new adult approvals to <u>approximately three weeks</u>. Therefore, if you are interested in becoming an adult volunteer with Ozaukee 4-H, please keep the extended time line in mind and sign-up early before the event(s) you wish to volunteer for.

SCIENCE: WISCONSIN AGRICULTURE
