### 4-H Enrollment Will Go On-Line

Wisconsin 4-H is switching over to a new on-line enrollment system this fall for all members and leaders. We will be joining 14 other state 4-H programs already using 4HOnline. Data entry will be handled by 4-H families, and because 4HOnline is web-based, enrollment information is available to your family, anytime, anywhere. 4HOnline is compatible with computers, tablets and smartphones and works well with slower internet connections. Many forms will only need to be entered once, and then just updated when necessary, like photo releases, health forms and liability forms.



#### WANT TO JOIN OZAUKEE COUNTY 4-H?

Enrollment is initiated by contacting one of the local 4-H Clubs and then proceeds with online enrollment using the website listed below - Please contact the general leader of the club you are interested in joining (see list below) and make arrangements to attend their next meeting.

<u>Cloverbuds:</u> Youth in Kindergarten through second grade may enroll in Cloverbuds.

**Explorer:** Youth in third and fourth grade. Youth are not required to take Exploring but are encouraged especially if it is their first year in 4-H.

**4-H Membership:** Regular membership is open to youth in third grade and above, through the next 4-H year following high school graduation. Youth *graduate* from 4-H when they finish high school **or** when they complete the year *past* high school. This is provided that they have completed three years of 4-H and achieved in their final year. All Youth need to sign a 4-H Behavior Agreement.

Youth are enrolled in 4-H by grade level only. The grade is determined as of September 1 of the current year. 4-H clubs promote new enrollment and re-enrollment from September 15 to November 1 each year, however, enrollment is open throughout the year, subject to specific guidelines.

Achievement Guidelines: Achievement means that a member has met the requirements of his/her local 4-H Club as well as the Ozaukee County 4-H program. Although club requirements vary, the Ozaukee County 4-H Leaders Association reminds families about the county achievement policy, which all clubs must follow:

Attend a 50% minimum number of general meetings, or more if set by the club.

Successfully complete each project, including attendance.

Exhibit in each project at County Fair or by some other public display

Complete a 4-H record book

**September 15:** Enrollment opens on 4HOnline at <a href="https://wi.4honline.com">https://wi.4honline.com</a>

**November 1:** Deadline for all new and returning enrollments for all 4-H Projects using 4HOnline.

Deadline for Livestock beef, sheep, swine) project enrollments. NO ADDS IN LIVESTOCK PROJECTS AFTER NOVEMBER 1<sup>ST</sup>. Members must be enrolled in the livestock project by this date to sell livestock

at county fair.

**February 1:** Deadline to **DROP** any 4-H project using 4HOnline and not affect club achievement.

Deadline to ADD any NON-LIVESTOCK project.

(Livestock projects add deadline is November 1<sup>st</sup> as stated above).

**NOTE:** Open enrollment continues for new members throughout the year, however some restrictions for exhibiting

at the Ozaukee County Fair do apply.

In recent years, the State of Wisconsin has required the presence of food safety certified personnel at all times where food is being prepared for and sold to the public, even for temporary food operations such as our Clover Café at the Ozaukee County Fair. We currently have 5 leaders who are food safety certified, but could use a few more.

Leaders would have involvement in the 4-H food stand operation at the county fair. Attendance at a 1 day class would be required, as well as a test after the class. Tuition costs are funded by the 4-H Leaders Association.

Deadline for Fall award applications is <u>October 15, 2013</u> Interview date is Wednesday, <u>November 7, 2013</u> for Fall award trips

How to Apply: Award trip ME application forms are available from the UW-Extension Office or on the Ozaukee County 4-H Website for Citizenship Washington Focus, American Spirit and National 4-H Conference. Space Camp application is also available from the UW-Extension Office or on the Ozaukee County 4-H Website.

#### **Fall Awards**

Space Camp: 4-H members in grades 6-8, may apply for this fun-filled Spring week-end at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center in Huntsville, Alabama on April 24-28, 2014. Participants will complete a simulated Space Shuttle mission, experience training simulators, tour the U.S. Space & Rocket Center and learn about becoming an astronaut. The cost is about \$525, partial sponsorship is available. For more information on Space Camp, check out: www.spacecamp.com

<u>Citizenship-Washington Focus</u>: A week long summer program held at the National 4-H Center in Washington D.C. Dates:TBD. Experience the city of Washington D.C. and see all the sites while learning about America's heritage, government, and learning civic responsibilities. You will get to know other 4-H members from Wisconsin and throughout the nation, and have the opportunity to meet your state legislators. Youth must be in 10th-12th grade this year. Cost is about \$1,100.00. Partial sponsorship are available.

American Spirit: Youth learn about the steps to independence and freedom on a journey through their American Heritage. Visit sites of historical importance in Philadelphia, Boston, NYC and Niagara Falls. Trip date is June 18-26, 2014. Youth need to have a sincere interest in learning about our history and heritage. Grade 8th-10th may apply. The approximate cost is \$1100.00. Partial sponsorship is available. Youth will need a passport to travel to Canada.

National 4-H Conference: Only six (6) youth are selected statewide to attend this working conference April 5-10, 2014 at the National 4-H Center in Washington D.C. One day is spent on Capitol Hill meeting with legislators and touring. Youth must be in 10th –12th grade. Ozaukee County can nominate one members to be considered for this experience. After county approval, youth must complete a state application in December 2013. The approximate cost is \$1100.00.

National 4-H Congress held in Atlanta, Georgia in late Fall, 2014 and is open to youth in 10th - 12th grade. An educational and cultural experience for 4-Hers from across the country. Congress includes self-development seminars, tours and a service project. Applicants must have a high level of demonstrated leadership skills, and implement a leadership program upon return. ME Form application. The cost for the trip is approximately \$1,100.00.

#### Wisconsin 4-H Key Award:

The 4-H Key Award represents the highest award you can achieve in 4-H. Selection is based on the applicants total 4-H record (consistent growth in project work and 4-H involvement, developed and applied leadership and teaching skills, personal development and active contributions to their club, County 4-H Program and community involvement). Applicants must have completed at least three years of club work and one year of youth leadership. Awards will be presented at the 2014 Leaders Banquet. ME Form application.

#### Wisconsin 4-H and Youth Conference:

Held June 23–26, 2014 on the UW-Madison Campus, participants take part in educational seminars and assemblies as they meet people from across Wisconsin. You must be in grades 8-10 at time of selection. Cost is approximately \$225.00. Use the Youth Conference application form

#### 2013 Ozaukee County Fair Food Stand REPORT

Thank you to the many customers and volunteers who helped make this year's food stand fundraiser a success! Thanks also to the Fair Board for their assistance with facility items, as well as an unexpected electrical issue. This was the first time the new building was used extensively. As you would expect, there were a couple of issues, however, county employees responded quickly and graciously to fix them.

In our new, permanent location, we were able to offer guests a full menu, along with a spacious, air-conditioned seating area in the café. ### **Haunt Job Descriptions**

#### 1. Outdoor Ghoulies

Costumed outdoor spooks. Escort guests from ticketing area to horse barn. Must have two costumed adult supervisors each night or ghoulies will not be allowed. Youth must be in 6<sup>th</sup> grade or older. Must attend training if you have never performed this job before.

#### 2. Parking Attendants

3 Adults / youth in 8<sup>th</sup> grade or older per night. Younger members must be accompanied by parent. Maintain organization and safety of lot. Direct guests to ticket area. Wear Staff T-shirt or costume.

#### 3. Ticket Sales

Communicate with Rule readers and Houston via radio. Two adults per night. Sell tickets to guests. Wear costume or Staff T-shirt

#### 4. Concessions

3 adults per night plus 2 youth per night. Youth younger than 6<sup>th</sup> grade must be accompanied by adult. Sell food and beverage to guests. Keep area clean. Remove trash. Costumes or Staff T-shirts.

#### 5. Rules readers

Minimum two volunteers per night. One must be adult. Second can be older youth. Read rules to guests in the Horse Barn. Wear costume or Staff T-shirt.

#### 6. Gatekeepers

Minimum four volunteers per night. Costumed and silent. Two must be adult. Others must be 8<sup>th</sup> grade or older. Put small groups of guests (4-6) into stalls. Scare guests in stalls. Release guests into Haunt at intervals.

#### Must attend training session if you have never performed this job before.

#### 7. Grim Reaper

Two costumed and silent Adult s or High Schoolers per evening. Escort guests from horse barn to Haunt entrance. **Must attend training session if never performed this job before.** 

#### 8. Actors

MUST be 8<sup>th</sup> grade and older. <u>No exceptions</u>. Adults encouraged to participate. Costumed volunteers will be assigned specific role in the Haunt. Responsible for scaring guests as well as maintaining a safe environment. **Must attend training session**.

#### 9. Crew

Scares guests while working behind the scenes. Operate special effects. Responsible for maintaining a safe environment. <u>Must attend training session.</u>

#### 10. Haunt Patrol

6 adults per evening. Dark costumes. Roam through assigned zone and maintain safety of guests and actors and crew. First responders to any problem. Radio contact. **Must attend training if you have never performed this job before** 

## **Haunt Job Descriptions (continued)**

#### 11. Make up

Adults and youth help actors apply makeup. Arrive at 4pm. Done by 6pm. Will need someone each night to clean up the makeup airbrush system. No training required.

#### 12. Costumes

Adults to return all costumes to hangers, clean masks, laundry and mending as necessary. One from 4-6pm and one from 10-11pm. No training required

13. Show Arena Attendants (The show Arena is just south of the Dairy Barn—this is where actor staging and the volunteer meal will take place)

Three adults / older youth from 4-7pm. Help set up meal. Make sure actors get to Haunt by 5:35pm. Check in all volunteers. Clean up meal

One to two adults from 7-10:30pm will monitor building, help distribute 8pm snack, check out all volunteers and help document service hours.

#### 14. Flex Worker

Volunteers who are willing to fill in a variety of different positions. Thanks for being flexible!

## TRAINING SESSIONS: Demystified (Who? When? Where?)

Who MUST come to training? Brand new volunteers who have never been to an overview training before. This training explains all jobs so you get an idea of how the Haunt runs every night. (Makeup, Costume and Jamboree volunteers do not need to come to any training but are always welcome!)

Training is MANDATORY for ALL Actors and Crew every year.

Training is MANDATORY for Haunt Patrol and for Ghoulies (Adult or youth) and for Gatekeepers and for Grim Reapers who have never performed this job before.


