Species Reports

Beef - Steve Rathke

- Weigh In is 4-7 Wednesday (1 time to weigh and grade) with all contracts signed by 7:00 pm
- Beef over 1450# are paid up to 1450
- Dairy over 1600# are paid up to 1600
- Must grade low choice to sell
- Show time is 8:00 am, be ready 1 hour early
- Order is Market, Showmanship, Breeding Stock, and Bred and Owned

Sheep - Bob & Mari Schmidt

- Wednesday weigh-in 2-6pm. Lambs should be slick-sheared and dry. If you need to retag, we can do it at weigh-in.
- 100-260# for sheep and must be average choice. Scrapie ear tag needed along with COOL forms and sheep form when weighing in
- Please have your blue sheet checked.
- Show is 11 am on Thursday (NEW)

- Sheep are the last in the sale this year
- There was a concern about shearing after weigh in, a motion was made to fit legs as needed. Motion carried.

#### Swine - Jim Hoerchner

- 2:00 - 6:00 Tuesday is check in -- drop off is the south side of the swine barn
- 6:30 pm Tuesday is Weigh In --- Matt Falkner is in charge, one family member must be present during the weigh-in.

- Hogs must be 220-295 (with 295# max payout) with an average grade 2 to sell
- Educational posters for hogs should go to Deanna Rychtik

#### All Species Announcements

- We will need help from all species to set up the auction on Thursday at 4:00 pm
- We also need help for the sale with signs and runners from all 3 species.
- Sale - line up on the south side of the show arena for all animals (hogs, beef, dairy beef, and sheep)
- No food in barns - 100 ft from building
- Keep animals and stalls clean
- Trucking --- If you are taking an animal home you can load on Sunday night. Non-sale animals that are going to the butcher or livestock yards must be in by NOON on Friday. (\$10 steers, \$5 hogs and sheep)
- If you haven't had your blue sheet checked, it must be done by the scale at the latest.
- A concern regarding animals that stay overnight came up with feeding. Sherry Jacque felt it was a long time without feed. Steve Rathke noted hay is provided to animals and told members they will need to provide and feed grain if they wish to. Changing a ration by

providing grain an animal is not used to can be dangerous for cattle.

- If you call the fair vet, when the vet comes through on their scheduled visit, you will be charged a vet check. It may be in your best interest to call your own vet if an issue arises.
- We will need help on Monday after the fair at 6:00 pm for clean-up
- Reminder --- Car Wash is August 19th at the Olson's Piggly Wiggly.
- If you are a senior and this is your last year, we will mention you in the auction program, please see us if you would like to be included.
