The Town has one major waterway, Cedar Creek, winding through its limits.


Amenities

The Town of Cedarburg includes six public parks spanning over 100 acres of recreational opportunities. The Town is also home to the Covered Bridge, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is the last bridge of its kind in Wisconsin. The Hamilton Historic District, also listed on the National Register, and several other local landmarks help recognize and preserve our history.

Scenic Routes have been designated throughout the Town to highlight some of the most picturesque natural, cultural, and historic features of the area.
