Meeting called to order at 7:35. The pledges were led by Jessica Mejchar.

It was noted the minutes needed to be corrected from February's meeting in regards to the business awards. A motion was made Jim to approve the secretary's report. Clara seconded it. Committee Reports:

Haunt: Looking for a chair for the Haunt and more volunteer help for the future.

Old Business:

Volunteer Hours at Fair: Steve said we should keep parking hours while still cutting back on other hours. The issue was brought up as to why we are trying to drop recycling and other shifts. New Business:

Meat Sale Fundraiser: Jim and Teri have organized a meat sale. One pound packages of ground beef and beef patties will be sold for \$5.50 a pound. This would replace the fruit sale.

They want 4-H to be in charge of food because it would be a huge help for them. Anyone can set up their own table to show off certain projects (examples; petting zoo, face painting, archery, drones, and many more).
