September marks the month to re-enroll in Ozaukee 4-H for 2018-2019!


### **Important Dates:**

September 6th: Re-enrollment available on 4-H Online

**September 30th:** Current 4-H Youth Re-enrollment **DEADLINE**.

**November 1st:** Last day to add ALL projects

Instructions are located online for re-enrollment in 4-H Online from the <u>website</u>. <u>Re-enroll Instructions</u>.



- Use Chrome or Firefox with 4H Online webpage.
- All current 4-H youth MUST re-enroll by the end of the day on September 30th.
- 4H Online will LOCK for re-enrolling on Sept. 30th .
- Use your current 4-H Online account when re-enrolling (you should **not** have to create a new account).
- Please double-check that all information is current/accurate and spelling/ punctuation is correct. This will help save some office time when reviewing/ approving re-enrollments.
- Club dues also need to be paid by September 30th.

The Leaders Association will pay for a 4-H t-shirt for **ALL YOUTH** enrollments this September!

Any 4-H adults that would like to purchase the 4-H t-shirt, may do so for \$10 each. Please look for sizing information and order form at your next general meeting or contact your general leader by **October 11th.**

### New Volunteer Orientation Dates

As we kick off another 4-H year, we welcome all new volunteers and thank you for your willingness to serve in this capacity. 4-H takes steps to ensure a safe and healthy environment for youth and encourages safeguards for adult leaders.

Each new volunteer is required to attend one evening of new volunteer orientation. Volunteers who have not enrolled in the last five years must also be retrained.

New Volunteer Orientation process includes the following:

- Complete the online enrollment form which includes a Volunteer Behavior Agreement
- Participate in a new volunteer orientation session
- Authorize a background check
- Complete online Mandated Reporter Training

The timeline for new adult approvals can be a few weeks. Therefore, if you are interested in becoming an adult volunteer with Ozaukee 4-H, please keep the extended timeline in mind and sign-up early before the event(s) you wish to volunteer for.

#### **BEEKEEPING: COUNTY-WIDE PROJECT**

What can you do in this project with local Beekeepers as mentors?

- Learn about bees as pollinators and the important role they play in our food supply as well as the plants and trees on which they forage.
- Learn about hive placement, legal and environmental considerations and the cost and time commitment for "beecoming" a beekeeper.
- Experience how to assemble various parts of a hive, use a smoker and hive tools and determine what bee-proof clothing to wear.
- Experience starting and managing a 4-H beehive at the Mequon Nature Preserve Apiary. This includes the harvesting of honey.
- Grades: 6-13

 Cost: \$25 due at first class. Fundraising efforts may also be necessary to purchase wooden hive parts, tools, supplies, bees and bee suits for participants.



#### Fair Board Note & Lost Items

The 2018 Ozaukee County Fair has come to a close. The Ozaukee County Fair Board would like to thank all the 4-H families that helped to make it another great Fair. From pre-Fair cleanup, to setup, exhibiting your projects, parking cars, post-Fair cleanup and everything in between, you all played a part in making this a fun and educational event for the Community. Your help is greatly appreciated.

Thank you to Larry & Deb Newell for all of their work in organizing & carrying out the 4-H Recycling Initiative at the Ozaukee County Fair! This year, Ozaukee 4-H families helped to recycle 940 pounds of aluminum! Ozaukee 4-H will be receiving a check for \$376! Perhaps you noticed significantly less garbage around the Fair again this year. With the help from Ozaukee 4-H, we have made large strides in reducing our carbon footprint during the Fair over the past 4 years! Many thanks to all the volunteers that helped with this effort!

2015: \$222.75 (405 lbs. of aluminum, 352 lbs. of plastic, plus cardboard & minimal glass)

2016: \$216 (432 lbs. of aluminum, 540 lbs. of plastic, plus cardboard & minimal glass)

2017: \$369 (820 lbs. of aluminum, 920 lbs. of plastic, 3,420 lbs. of cardboard plus minimal glass)

2018: \$376 (940 lbs. of aluminum, 2.15 tons of cardboard)

# WI 4-H International Programs Insight

The Best Month in Costa Rica! Thanks to 4-H!

This summer I was one of two people selected to go on the 2018 Costa Rica Exchange from Wisconsin. Through the IFYE (International Foreign Youth Exchange) program, I traveled with twelve other 4-Hers from around the United States to Costa Rica. I was placed with a host family in the San Jose Province, but more specifically Turrubares County. While living in Costa Rica for a month, I learned very much about the culture while I was trying new things and meeting new people. During the course of the month, I saw many different places, tried new foods, and met a lot of people. I was able to go to my host sister's school for two of the four weeks while I was there; it was very different because they only spoke Spanish and their school year goes from March to the end of November. The school systems in Costa Rica have very relaxed schedules and it made going to school fun and very exciting. The school I went to had a two week (Winter Break), and during it I spent more time with my host family around their farm. My host parents and I would spend hours milking their twenty-five cows by hand, and I can only imagine how long it takes them to do it all by themselves.

One of my favorite things I did in Costa Rica was going dancing with my host sister and friends. Dancing is a huge part of the culture in Costa Rica and everyone there knows how to dance in their own style of the Tango, Cha Cha, or Salsa. I spent time learning how to do most of the steps of those dances from my friends from Costa Rica. Another thing I did there, that was very common was walk. I walked almost everywhere that I went. I even went on a walk with some friends from school that turned out to be a thirteen mile hike. I also drank water out of a waterfall on that hike, because my host sister did not tell me that we were going to be climbing up a mountain and that I should've brought along water.

One of the things that I found very unique about Costa Rica is that they have a lot of different types of fruit. So many different types that they didn't even know what some of them were called in Spanish or English. The farm that I lived on was in the middle of the mountains and we had many different fruit trees in our yard, like star fruit, mango, lime, and others. Another thing that I found special to Costa Rica is that everyone had a hammock at their house. I spent a lot of time sleeping and relaxing in the hammock we had at our house. My host dad bought a hammock for me and gave it to me just before I left.

Costa Rica was an amazing trip and I am so blessed to have been given the chance to travel there! Thanks to 4-H, I have been able to go and experience a new way of living, and make new long lasting relationships with the people I met in Costa Rica.

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award provides special recognition to 4-H members who have shown consistent & exceptional growth in the 4-H program, who have developed exceptional leadership ability, and who have been helpful members in their club and community. This is the highest honor a 4-H member can receive. The 2018 Wisconsin 4-H Key Award was given to three members of Ozaukee County 4-H.

An awards presentation was held Sunday afternoon of the Fair.


