Species Reports

Beef - Steve Rathke

- 4-7 pm weight in Jackie will checking off your "blue sheets" at the weigh in...7pm due date...Make sure you have your paperwork filled it --- It must list YOU or Your Parent as the owner of the animal for DATCP Paperwork
- Weigh once and Grade once
- Must grade low choice to sell in the sale
- There is a maximum payout on all beef for the sale 1450 beef and 1600 dairy beef
- There should not be "discussion with the grader while they are grading...after is ok...
- Fair board paperwork needs to be brought along; breeding stock should have ear tags and documentation when they come to the fairgrounds.
- Be sure to clean up after your animals at the fair...as well as feeding and watering
- Beef Show at 8 am...Market animals

Showmanship Breeding stock

 Dairy Beef sell first in the sale; then sheep, hogs, and beef; move all animals down the EAST side of the barns to the sale ring...MISS your SPOT in the sale--YOU will NOT sell...buyer posters must be

- up by 10am on Friday. Get information to Steve for the shipment of your 2nd animal...
- Be respectful of other animals when you are walking your steers during the Horse Show...
- No Food in the buildings
- Educational Posters should be turned in at the scale by 7:00 Wednesday.
- See Heidi or Deanna if you have questions about dress code.

Sheep - Bob & Mari Schmit

- 4-7pm weigh in; 2 sheep can be weighed in and shown. Sheep need to be slick sheared for the weigh in. Grade needs to be Average choice. Weights 100-160 pounds. Max payout is 160
- Females need scrapies tag. No discussion with the grader during grading. The scale has been certified.
- Keep sheep out of the concrete isle in the horse barn. Dispose of water in the north or south end of the barn.
- Make sure you have a record book sheets and DATCP sheets with you.

Swine - Jim Hoerchner

- 2-6 pm arrival time to check in. You will need your pink VET papers, and swine documentation when you check in on Tuesday.
 6:30 weigh in Tuesday nite. Average 2 to sell in the sale. Sale payment is on 220-295 pounds. (Max payout is 295)
- Matt Falkner will be in charge of running the isles for the weigh in. Be at your pen so you are ready when it is your turn...
- Second hog sheet due to Jim by Friday at NOON with trucking fee of \$10
- Swine youth need to do "garbage' pickup in and around the swine barn...see note posted in the barn.
- If you need to see Jim during the fair, look in the SE corner of the swine barn.
- Show starts at 3:00 pm

In General from Joe and Steph:

- Herdsmanship has some changes...clubs have the opportunity to judges other clubs within their same species. One adult and one youth from each club --- forms can be picked up on Friday.
- Thanks to those who helped with cleaning out and setting up prior to the fair. Clean up after the Fair will be on Monday.
- Need youth to help put shavings into the arena after the meeting.

- If you purchase shavings, it is \$5.50 per bag --- money due at the end of fair.
- Deanna needs to see specific youth after the meeting...
- Auction/Dinner set-up...around 330-4 on Thursday afternoon and cleanup after the sale...a reminder to Beef and Dairy Beef youth--you sell first, so please be sure to be back at the sale arena to help with cleanup...also looking for helpers to put signs during the sale...find Heidi before/after you sell to help out...
