MOTIVATING FARMERS IN A TIME OF CHANGE Building Confidence in Listening & Communication Skills

Stephanie developed and presented "Motivating Farmers in a Time of Change" with Area 15 colleague Tina Kohlman at the National Farm Business Management Conference in Sheboygan. This two hour session was targeted towards early career professionals to help them gain confidence in listening and communication skills. The conference was hosted by local ag professionals who work with area farmers and Extension professionals regularly.

Ninety people participated in this interactive session which featured a mixture of lecture, videos, group discussion and activities which were designed to help ag professionals develop become proficient at working with farmers and helping the farmers make

# decisions they feel comfortable with. Based on a 5-point Likert scale, participants (n=38) rated their knowledge before and after the session and indicated a 0.92 increase in knowledge after participating in the session.

Comments received included "loved everything-did a great job", "fun approach to the topic", "great delivery and examples of a tough topic!", "you

show great enthusiasm about this topic and your knowledge is thorough", "very well structured program, appreciated the hands on and group activities you gave us", "good ways to think about ways better to communicate", and "handouts are very well



## **Community Development**

Karina developed a social media plan for the 10th Anniversary Treasures of Oz Eco Tour, which was held on June 15, 2019. This annual event celebrates the natural gems of Ozaukee County and attracts hundreds of visitors with a chance to discover the beauty, passive peace, and opportunities our recreational in parks and preserves.

In the months leading up to the event, Karina worked with event organizers to prepare event flyers and brochures, create event maps, draft engaging content to be shared via Facebook and Instagram, and create social media ads.

This year's event featured an infusion of art through the ARTservancy project—a yearlong collaborative residency program between the Ozaukee Washington Land Trust and Gallery 224. Artists provided a unique perspective at each preserve and shared their work with visitors.

The event featured six sites: Birchwood Hills Nature Preserve, Cedarburg Environmental Study Area, Forest Beach Migratory Preserve, Hames Preserve, Sauk Creek Nature Preserve, and Virmond County Park. A total of 581 visits were recorded between the six sites—attendance was lower than past years, possibly due to the swift drop in temperature at noon on the day of the event.
