We have many exciting opportunities within our club for the coming months. Please remember to sign up for those your family would like to participate in as we need to know before the day of the event the number we expect. Here are our current signups and upcoming events:



Riveredge Night Hike on April 4, 2020 from 7:15pm - 9:15pm: Back by popular demand is the night hike! The club will be broken into two groups due to

our size. The club can pay for one adult **per family** to participate in the hike. Depending on how many youths are participating will determine if we can allow any additional family members to attend (the cost would be \$6/per additional person). No signup yet.

Riveredge crayfish and insects on June 20th from 1pm - 3pm: We will have two different activities running at the same time (youth members can only choose one of these activities to participate in). The Cloverbuds and for older youth members who are interested, we have insect catching and exploring. They youth will be taken into the fields and forest to catch and study the bugs they find. This will include sketching and making a poster of the insects. The second is for youth in 3rd grade and above who do not want to participate in the insect exploring: crawfish catch/release. This will involve teamwork and for those who want, they can get into the water to help with the catching process. The others can stay on land to help with the counting and observation needs. No signup yet.

The four H's stand for Head, Heart, Hands, and Health, and signify the development of the whole person. 4-H is an informal, educational youth organization, and our county has a large and active program. You'll be involved in year-round project work and club and county activities, local community service and learn valuable life skills through your 4-H participation.

Boys and girls in 5K through grade 13 are eligible to join 4-H. Parents and adults are encouraged to be volunteer leaders. 4-H is open to anyone regardless of race, color, creed, sex, national origin, disability, religion or ancestry.
