 - outdoor moved from 50 to 150 with pods of 10 to pods of 20, no time restraints for outdoors, distance of 6 feet between non-family members
 - o indoors up to 50 people if 30% of room capacity pods of 20 with 20 feet apart
 - Can be indoors for 4 hours instead of 2
