

Ozaukee County 4-H Camp Chaperone Position Descriptions

All staff, youth and adults, are responsible for creating a safe and supportive environment for campers by leading educational theme programs, serving as campfire leaders, and participating in camp planning meetings. This volunteer role is a valuable leadership opportunity, requiring commitment, teamwork, and dedication to fostering a positive camp experience.

Adult Chaperone

Provides supervision and support to youth leaders, ensuring a safe and inclusive camp environment. Assists in managing daily logistics, monitoring camper well-being, and resolving challenges. Works closely with the 4-H Educator and staff to foster a positive experience. Chaperones may specialize in roles such as medical coordinator, dining hall coordinator, or activity coordinator. Single-day and multi-day chaperone shifts are available, with transportation accommodations required. CPR/First Aid certification is preferred but not required.

Camp Medic

Oversees camper health and safety, providing first aid and medical support as needed. Works with the 4-H Educator and staff to ensure a safe environment, assists in camp logistics, and participates in camp activities. CPR/First Aid certification is required. May serve as a first aid coordinator or assist in other camp areas as needed.
