Needs Assessment

Youth Empowerment – The Youth Empowerment means giving young people meaningful roles in decision-making, leadership, and planning. When youth have a voice and are trusted with responsibility, they gain confidence, build critical life skills, and stay more engaged in the program. In my work, this looks like youth leading camp activities, shaping future program locations, serving on advisory boards, and helping design workshops. Empowered youth don't just participate, they lead, and that's what keeps our 4-H program strong, relevant, and growing.

Current Projects:

• Summer Camp

- Led Base Camp for 55 youth (grades 3–6) and Adventure Camp for 16 youth (grades 7–9) at Upham Woods, focusing on outdoor learning and leadership July 7-9, 2025.
- 2026 camp dates are set; new location (Camp Lakotah) is being secured based on youth feedback.

• 4-H Club & Group Meetings

 Attending meetings helps build relationships, support club health, and guide improvements in youth engagement.

• New Fair Family Orientation

 Provided guidance for first-time families to ensure a successful, confident Fair experience, specifically within educational components.

• Fair Judges Orientation

 Trained judges on youth development, age-appropriate feedback, and consistent evaluation practices in regards to the 4-H values.

Ozaukee County Fair – Youth Engagement and Recruitment

 Promote 4-H in the Expo building during the Fair to encourage new enrollments into the organization.

 Forming a board to give older youth a voice in county programming and develop their leadership skills.
